The ICCC program is comprised of four key components with a time commitment of 40 hours spread over a 5-month period.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS



OPENING SEMINAR

Full day in-person training seminar providing presentations in strategy, marketing, talent management, and finance led by renowned business professors from across the country



ONE-ON-ONE COACHING

Two coaching pipelines where participants can choose one or both: general business and capital coaching



DIGITAL LEARNING SERIES

Combination of both targeted 60-minute webinars presented by experts as well as ondemand online personalized courses with key deliverables

Culminating conference bringing together participants in ICCC and other ICIC business programs focused on networking and finalizing your business strategy
